This month of May is full of exciting ministries as well.

- Thursday, May 4 is the National Day of Prayer I commend to you 3 community observances: the Interfaith Observance (sponsored by Associated Ministries) at 4 pm at Pacific Lutheran University (see me for car-pooling), and Christian observances at Cheney Stadium at Noon and at the University Place Town Center at 4:30 pm.
- Sunday, May 7, 3 pm, is our last Organ concert of our 2016-2017 season, featuring Naomi Shiga, Jonathan Wohlers and other musicians.
- Sunday, May 14 (Mother's Day), Bishop Greg Rickel will be with us at 8 am and 10 am to lead worship, preach, confirm and baptize. Plan to be here to share with our bishop in the joy of Eastertide.

- Our Easter season adult class continues on Monday evenings at 7 pm through May 22 on the Apostles' Creed, 114 words that unite Christians of all churches and through history.


Rector's Report continued

- Also in May, I invite you to consider supporting the **Capital Campaign for St. Mark's Cathedral**. Our Vestry has pledged 1% of our giving in 2017 (the portion that went in years past to theological education). More information is available at www.saintmarks.org/serve/donations/living-stones. The congregation of our diocesan cathedral have raised most of the funds for their first and critically needed renovations. I invite you to consider sharing in this diocesan ministry and witness.
- Looking ahead, St. Andrew's will take on a second week of serving homeless families through the **Family Housing Network** (FHN) (formerly called Phoenix Housing or Ruby Slippers). Besides our regular December week, primarily staffed by members of Temple Beth El, St. Andrew' will host 4-5 families in our downstairs from **July 15-22**. This will take the place of Vacation Bible School we hope that children and families will be involved with providing an evening meal each night and then some games and fellowship for the children of our guests. FHN will have folks to spend the night. Please see Fr. Martin if you are interested in helping to organize our ministry with our neighbors in need. (Re-read Matthew 25:31-46).

A Curate for St. Andrew's?

Bishop Rickel has asked St. Andrew's to consider participating in a half-time curacy: mentoring a newly ordained priest for two years. The Diocese would provide half of the compensation for the position, with St. Andrew's covering the other half (salary, pension and health benefits). Our Finance Committee has determined that financial support is available for our share in the compensation.

A curate is a member of the clergy engaged to assist a rector or vicar. In our case, the ministries and responsibilities of the curate (assisting priest) would be discerned by the Vestry, Rector and congregation and the curate together over the coming few months. This position will not take the place of, or diminish, the ministries of Fr. Ed, Linda Brice, Pam Tinsley, Sunshine DeGennaro or Matthew Moravec. We look for this curacy to help us develop new ministries within and beyond our congregation as we seek to know Christ and to make Christ known. The curacy would begin July 1.
